Summary Conclusions of the APEC Budget and Management Committee Meeting APEC Secretariat, Singapore 20-21 October 2008

Introduction

- 1. The APEC Budget and Management Committee (BMC) held its third 2008 meeting at the APEC Secretariat, Singapore, on 20-21 October 2008.
- 2. The Meeting was attended by representatives from Australia; Brunei Darussalam; Canada; Chile; China; Hong Kong, China; Indonesia; Japan; Korea; Malaysia; New Zealand; Peru; the Philippines; the Russian Federation; Singapore; Chinese Taipei; Thailand; the United States of America (the United States); Viet Nam and the APEC Secretariat. Mexico and Papua New Guinea were not represented. The list of participants is in <u>Annex 1</u>.
- 3. The Meeting was chaired by Mr. Andrew Todd, Assistant Secretary, Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT), Australia.

Agenda Item 1 : Chair's Opening Remarks

4. The Chair welcomed Members to the third BMC meeting of 2008, noting that he had recently assumed the chairmanship of the BMC. The Chair noted that there was a significant agenda, including important financial and project management reforms. The Chair thanked the Russian Federation for its US\$500,000 pledge to the APEC Support Fund (ASF) and noted that BMC had intersessionally approved the establishment of a sub-fund for capacity building initiatives to harness new technologies.

Agenda Item 2 : Adoption of Agenda

5. The Chair proposed the inclusion of his closing remarks as agenda item 14. The Meeting adopted the Revised Agenda, which appears in <u>Annex 2</u>. The Meeting agreed to the Chair's suggestion that agenda item 5.1 on the Role of the Chief Operating Officer be discussed among heads of delegations, in consultation with the Executive Director (ED) and Deputy ED (DED).

Agenda Item 3 : Business Arrangements and Program

6. The Meeting agreed to the business arrangements and program as set out in <u>2008/BMC3/002</u>.

Agenda Item 4 : Overview of Secretariat by Executive Director

- 7. The ED provided an overview of developments at the Secretariat as detailed in <u>2008/BMC3/003</u>. His key points were:
 - The Secretariat had managed to largely absorb the exchange rate losses and higher prices of goods and services by implementing various austerity measures. The Secretariat would continue its efforts to achieve budget efficiencies. The ED called upon the BMC to guide the Secretariat in looking for ways to improve its long-term financial sustainability.
 - Fifteen economies met the 31 March deadline for the payment of Members' contributions.
 - The ED welcomed New Zealand's paper on options to deal with the exchange rate risk faced by the Secretariat and the recommendations of the USA-led Small Working Group (SWG) to reform project management processes. With the BMC's guidance and support, the Secretariat would do its best to implement the recommendations. He noted that a record 149 projects have been submitted for consideration by the BMC this year.

- The ED thanked Australia, Japan and Singapore for their contributions to Policy Support Unit (PSU). Mr. Philip Gaetjens assumed the position of PSU Manager in August 2008. The ED also noted the departure and arrival of a number of Program Directors (PDs) and Program Executives (PEs) in 2008.
- 8. The Chair thanked the ED for the overview and his continued support for the BMC.
- 9. In response to Hong Kong, China's enquiry on the resource implications for the Secretariat during Singapore's hosting year in 2009, the DED assured the Meeting that despite the anticipated increase in demand for Secretariat support during the year, the Secretariat would continue to operate in a cost-effective manner. A modest budget for supporting the meetings that would be held in Singapore has been factored into the proposed 2009 Administrative Account (AA) budget, which would be considered by Members under agenda item 6.2.

Agenda Item 5 : Management Issues

5.2 Structure of the APEC Secretariat

10. The Meeting noted the Secretariat's staffing and management decisions outlined in <u>2008/BMC3/004</u>, including to: not fill the post of Director Information Technology (IT); retain the DED's Executive Assistant and revise the job scope; and retain the DED's chauffeur for 2009. Director (Administration) clarified that the retention of the second chauffeur in 2009 was designed to meet the additional administrative and logistical requirements flowing from the increased number of meetings to be held in Singapore next year.

5.3 **Proposed Information Technology (IT) initiatives**

11. Chief Operating Officer (COO) briefed the Meeting on the major IT initiatives proposed for 2009, which included an audit of the Secretariat's IT resources and upgrading the Project Database (PDB) of the APEC Information Management Portal (AIMP). The Meeting endorsed Phase 1 of the proposed IT initiatives. To ensure the upgrading efforts are in line with the recommendations of SWG on Project Management Reform, the Secretariat agreed to provide the Terms of Reference (TOR) of the upgrade works to the SWG for comment. The Secretariat confirmed it would follow the established rules and procedures in the procurement process to ensure accountability and transparency.

Agenda Item 6 : Financial Reports and Budgets

12. The DED provided an overview of the Secretariat's budget situation in 2008 and 2009, explaining that the sharp depreciation of the US dollar against the Singaporean dollar and the surge in inflation in Singapore meant the Secretariat must request a small additional allocation in the 2008 AA budget and an increase in the projected 2009 AA budget. The DED reiterated that the Secretariat had absorbed most of the expenses through vigorous cost-saving measures. Noting the small size of the Secretariat's budget compared to other comparable multinational organizations (e.g. the Asia-Europe Foundation and ASEAN Secretariat), the DED considered that the Secretariat was lean and cost-effective.

6.1 Third Quarterly Report of the AA for the Period Ending on 30 September 2008 and Adjustments to the 2008 AA Budget

13. The Meeting welcomed the third quarterly report of the AA and approved the adjusted 2008 AA budget with an additional funding allocation of US\$44,900 at <u>Annex 3</u>. Director (Finance) advised the revised estimates were projected based on committed activities of the Secretariat before the end of 2008.

6.2 2009 AA Budget

14. The Meeting approved the 2009 AA budget (<u>Annex 4</u>) for Senior Officials' approval, noting that it had been prepared based on spending levels in recent years and anticipated activities

in 2009. In response to a query from New Zealand, the DED explained that he planned to develop the research capacity of the Secretariat to enhance its support to APEC fora. A minimal amount of budget of US\$2,000 was proposed for such purpose.

6.3 2009 Members' Contributions

15. The Meeting noted the level of Members' contributions in 2009 (<u>Annex 5</u>), recalling that Ministers had directly linked the 30 per cent increase in Members' contributions from 2009 to the continuation of processes to streamline and professionalize APEC's operations.

6.4 Cost-Saving Measures for AA

- 16. The Meeting welcomed the cost-saving measures introduced by the Secretariat. New Zealand noted that the variations in the AA budgets were dependent on the travel costs associated with the choice of the host. Singapore added that the streamlining of the APEC Calendar had created savings for the Secretariat and invited future hosts to take this into consideration.
- 17. The Meeting noted the budget efficiencies achieved by the Secretariat and urged the Secretariat to continue with its efforts to save costs.

6.5 Communication and Outreach Budget

- 18. The Meeting noted the Secretariat's review of its communications and outreach budget, which was prepared based on the recommendations of the Ogilvy Report of 2001. While supporting the strengthening of communications and outreach capability of the Secretariat, Japan urged the Secretariat to remain vigilant in reducing costs. The budget should also be set at an appropriate and reasonable level. The United States judged that while it was important to have a vibrant team of professionals in the communications and outreach, bonuses, which are available to all staff, should be based on methodical performance appraisals. Responding to a query by Korea, Director (Communications) said that a paper comparing the resources devoted to communications and outreach in Secretariat with those in other multinational organizations was provided to BMC 2 in 2007 and that it could be updated and provided to BMC. Thailand reiterated that the responsibility for APEC outreach also lies with each member economy.
- 19. Noting the establishment of the Friends of the Chair (FOTC) on Communications, the Meeting agreed that the Secretariat should share its review with the FOTC.

6.6 Administrative Account Budget Forecasts - 2010-2013

- 20. The Secretariat provided updated AA budget forecasts for 2010-13 in <u>2008/BMC3/011</u>. Based on the revised S\$/US\$ exchange rate of 1.4 (previously 1.5) and projected expenditures of the Secretariat during the forecasted period, the forecasts indicated that the AA would be in deficit from 2010.
- 21. The Meeting noted with concern the forecasted deficits and agreed with Singapore's proposal that a Small Working Group (SWG) be established to review the long-term financial sustainability of the APEC Secretariat and recommend measures to achieve this. It was agreed that the SWG would also make recommendations regarding the exchange rate risk mitigation mechanism agreed under agenda item 6.7.
- 22. The SWG will comprise the outgoing Chair (Australia), incoming Chair (Peru) and Vice Chair (Singapore), the United States, China and Japan. Other interested Economies were also invited to join the SWG.

6.7 Exchange Rate Risk Mitigation

23. The Meeting commended the New Zealand-led SWG for the excellent analysis and recommendations to address the exchange risks faced by the Secretariat (<u>2008/BMC3/012</u>).

- 24. The Meeting agreed in principle to assess and pay Members' contributions in a mix of US dollars (US\$) and Singaporean dollars (S\$), noting that this would provide the greatest level of stability and certainty for the AA budget. The Meeting also agreed to seek Senior Officials' endorsement in 2008. It also instructed the SWG established under agenda item 6.6 to recommend the level at which the US\$ and S\$ contributions should be set for possible implementation in 2010.
- 25. While agreeing in-principle, Chinese Taipei and Viet Nam sought additional time to consider the matter further. The United States agreed in principle, and referred to paragraph 9 (setting the Singaporean dollar contributions) of the paper on defining an exchange rate as an important option to consider.

Agenda Item 7 : Strengthening Project Management Processes

7.1 Guide on APEC Projects Proposal Gender Criteria

26. The Meeting approved the Practical Guide on Gender Criteria for APEC Project Proposals (2008/BMC3/013) prepared by the Gender Focal Point Network (GFPN) and China. The Guide will be annexed to the Guidebook on APEC Projects.

7.2 Project Management Reform

- 27. The Meeting expressed its appreciation to Economies that participated in the SWG on Project Management Reform (led by the United States) and its various sub-groups (led by New Zealand, the United States, Australia and Hong Kong, China) for their comprehensive review of the APEC project management process.
- 28. The Meeting endorsed in full the recommendations and next steps in the decision matrix of <u>2008/BMC3/014-04</u>. It approved <u>2008/BMC3/014-02</u> (SWG Recommendations for BMC Approval) and <u>2008/BMC3/014-03</u> (BMC Recommendation for CSOM Endorsement) and agreed to recommend that CSOM endorse the recommendations.
- 29. The Meeting inter alia supported:
 - a capacity-building annex to Leaders' statements
 - longer-term strategic fora workplans
 - an annual planning session between Committee chairs
 - a strengthened Project Management Unit (PMU) in the APEC Secretariat
 - re-writing the project guidebook
 - transitional period for 2009 to set quarterly approval sessions from 2010
 - delegating BMC authority to approve projects under \$200,000 to speed up fund disbursement
 - consultancy to review current project assessment, prioritization, ranking and evaluation systems
 - consultancy to consider part or full devolution of project management to APEC members
 - upgrade of the Project Database.
- 30. It was agreed that four issues deserved further consideration:
 - the working mechanism for the annual planning sessions among Chairs of the EC, CTI, SCE, FMP, ABAC and other stakeholders. It was suggested that the SOM Chair or Secretariat could organize a discussion in the margins of a Senior Official Meeting.
 - the practicalities of long-term projects for fora with a limited mandate

- ways to strengthen the PMU. Australia advised that it had agreed to reassign one of its seconded Program Directors to head the PMU as a temporary measure. Economies were urged to contribute staff or financial resources to strengthen the PMU. The Meeting was also advised that US-APEC Technical Assistance and Training Facility would help to strengthen the PMU and its processes.
- the transition to quarterly project approval sessions from 2010. The SWG sub-group that recommended quarterly sessions (led by Australia) offered to prepare a paper on the 2009 transitional arrangements. Australia indicated that, based on discussions in the margins of the BMC meeting, it appeared that there could be three modest project approval sessions in 2009. Japan signaled that the BMC should provide sufficient notice to fora on the implementation details, including funds available for each session and submission deadlines, and be cognizant of the resource implications for the Secretariat and BMC members. Australia urged Economies to provide one-off injections into the project funds to facilitate the transition
- 31. During the discussions on project management reform, Singapore noted that the SCE would be developing a comprehensive, forward-looking goal-orientated ECOTECH workplan following a stock-take of capacity building activities. Singapore undertook to provide the findings to the incoming SCE Chair and the joint planning session.

7.3 Amendments to the Guidebook on APEC Projects

32. The Meeting approved the Secretariat's proposed minor amendments to the Sixth Edition Guidebook on APEC projects as set out in <u>2008/BMC3/015</u>.

Agenda Item 8 : Approval of 2009 Projects

- 33. The Chair noted that the value of project funding bids significantly exceeded the project funds available. A number of Economies expressed disappointment that certain projects were not recommended by the Secretariat for funding. The Chair agreed to write to Chairs/Lead Shepherds of APEC fora to explain the decision-making process.
- 34. Several Economies noted that the Secretariat's recommendations were based on the agreed assessment criteria. As part of project management reform, the SWG would look into strengthening the process of ranking and categorizing projects, including the formula and weighting of quality scores.
- 35. Proponents of unsuccessful projects are invited to strengthen their proposals and re-submit in 2009.

8.1 2009 Operational Account Budget

- 36. Noting anticipated Members' contributions, 2009 AA expenditure and the Operational Account (OA) reserves, the Meeting agreed to fund the OA at US\$1,900,000 in 2009. The Meeting also agreed that around 25% (\$500,000) of this should be set aside for projects in early 2009, leaving approximately **US\$1,400,000** for allocation at the Meeting.
- 37. The United States, the proposing Economy for EWG 16/2009 and EWG 17/2009, agreed to merge the two projects with a view to achieving a higher degree of synergy and to save costs.

[Post-meeting note: Noting the funding available for this combined project, the Project Overseer (PO) confirmed to proceed with EWG 16/2009 only.]

38. The merger of EWG 16/2009 and EWG 17/2009 allowed the Meeting to approve projects ranked to be of medium quality and rank one or two under the SCE's ranking criteria. The projects are:

EWG 11/2009; EWG 05/2009; EWG 01/2009; EWG 02/2009; IST 01/2009; TPT 02/2009; FWG 01/2009; EWG 04/2009; MTF 01/2009; CTTF 01/2009; MRC 01/2009; ATC 01/2009; ACT 01/2009; SCE 01/2009; EWG 03/2009; HRD 01/2009; HRD 02/2009 and EWG 16/2009.

- 39. The funding approved in the 2009 OA is US\$1,468,016. Details appear in <u>Annex 6</u>.
- 40. It was agreed that projects ranked as being of medium quality and of rank three or four priority could be revised and submitted to the Secretariat for consideration as APEC Support Fund (ASF) projects by 28 October 2008.
- 41. As the proposing Economy for EC 01/2009 and IST 02/2009, Thailand informed the Meeting that EC 01/2009 would now be self-funded and that she would resubmit IST 02/2009 for funding under the ASF. The Meeting took note and supported with great appreciation Thailand's proposal to self-fund EC 01/2009.

8.2 2009 TILF Special Account Budget

- 42. The Meeting noted the agreement at BMC2 (subsequently endorsed by SOM2) that the affordable level of expenditure for the 2009 TILF Special Account projects was US\$3,500,000. The Meeting agreed to set aside 20% (US\$700,000) for projects in early 2009. Hence, it was agreed that the funding available for consideration at the Meeting would be around **US\$2,800,000**.
- 43. Though there was suggestion that there should be an opportunity of intersessional approval for TILF proposals which were not approved this time, the Meeting did not reach the agreement for an intersessional session.
- 44. The Meeting noted that the funds would almost cover all the medium quality TILF Special Account projects, inclusive of the proposed B-category proposals that require further clarification by 28 October 2008, and approved the funding for the following proposals:
 - (a) High Priority/Medium Quality

Details appear in Annex 7.

45. The Meeting expressed appreciation to Japan for its ongoing contributions to the TILF Special Account and to the United States for its 2007 contribution to the account. The Chair urged the other Economies to contribute to the Account.

8.3 2009 APEC Support Fund (ASF) Budget

- 46. The Meeting noted the funds available for allocation in 2009 by each ASF sub-account:
 - a. ASF General Fund: US<u>\$3,974,387</u>

- b. Human Security Sub-Fund: US\$31,245
- c. Human Security Sub-Fund (Avian Influenza and Emerging and Infectious Diseases): **US\$2,032,435**
- d. TFAP II Implementation Sub-Fund: US\$502,948.
- 47. The Meeting approved all projects of medium quality with revised project proposals as recommended in paragraph 19 of 2008/BMC3/018.
 - (a) High priority (Category 1) medium quality:

- (c) Category B projects: ATCWG 11/2009A, MTF 02/2009A
- 48. Some Members suggested that the following proposals could be merged to maximize the impact of their delivery: EWG 11/2009A and EWG 10/2009A; and HRD 03/2009A and MTF 02/2009A. Relevant POs were asked to consider the possibility in the spirit of better coordination. It was noted that the potential combination would not be focused on release of funds.

[Post-meeting note: The relevant POs have subsequently informed the Secretariat that merging of the above proposals would not be feasible; however, POs would coordinate.]

49. The Meeting agreed to spend up to 75% of the total ASF General Fund available. Noting that funding is still available in the ASF budget, the Meeting agreed to re-consider as part of the 2008 BMC3 approval session proposals that were categorized as high priority but low quality ASF project proposals, as well as OA proposals that were assessed to be of medium quality but were unable to secure funding due to the insufficiency of OA funds. A maximum amount of US\$674,543 is available for these projects. All re-submitted proposals will undergo a quality assessment by the Secretariat and must meet the ASF criteria (i.e., they must address capacity building for developing economies in high priority sectors for economic and technical cooperation). The Secretariat will maintain the same strict criteria applied in the previous round. The deadline for submission to the Secretariat was 28 October 2008. The revisions will be re-assessed and recommendations will be submitted to BMC for final decision.

[Post-meeting note: BMC subsequently reassessed and approved additional ASF projects totalling US\$625,832 including CTI 05/2009A, TWG 02/2009A, ATCWG 03/2009A, ACT 03/2009A, ATCWG 04/2009A and original OA projects TPTWG 03/2009, SOM 01/2009 and HRD 05/2009.]

The full list of approved 2009 ASF projects appears in Annex 8.

- 50. The Meeting expressed appreciation to the ASF contributors in 2008, including Australia, China, Korea and Hong Kong, China.
- 51. Noting the availability of funds in the Human Security Sub-Fund (Avian Influenza and Emerging and Infectious Diseases), the Chair invited Economies to submit quality project proposals in this area.

Agenda item 9 : Progress of Approved Projects

52. The Meeting noted the Secretariat paper on the Progress of Approved Projects (2008/BMC3/019).

Agenda item 10 : Chair and Vice-Chair for 2009

53. Peru and Singapore confirmed that they would assume the posts of Chair and Vice-Chair of the BMC respectively in 2009.

Agenda item 11 : Meeting Schedule in 2009

54. The Meeting agreed to hold the next BMC meeting in the margins of SOM1 to discuss the work plan of the BMC for the year.

[Post-meeting note: BMC1 2009 has been tentatively scheduled for 16 February 2009, 8pm. Further information will be provided together in the Administrative Circular for SOM1 and related meetings.]

Agenda item 12 : Other Business

Briefing by the Manager of PSU

55. The Meeting welcomed the new PSU Manager, Mr Philip Gaetjens, who briefed Members on the PSU's work plan (<u>2008/BMC3/021</u>). The Chair thanked Australia, Japan and Singapore for their contributions to the PSU.

Agenda item 13 : Classification of Documents

56. The Meeting noted the classification list which appeared as <u>2008/BMC3/000</u>. Documents containing budgetary information will be made publicly accessible only after the endorsement of the relevant budgets by Ministers.

Agenda item 14 : Chair's Closing Remarks

57. In closing, the Chair summarized the outcomes of BMC3 meeting. He also thanked all BMC Members for their staunch support and highly constructive approach towards the BMC's ambitious and substantial work program in 2008. He observed that the BMC was one of the four key committees of APEC. It was charged with ensuring the sustainability and credibility of APEC and it therefore deserved high-level attention and participation.
