

An influenza pandemic has the potential to infect hundreds of millions world-wide, threatening global economies, security, and stability. The highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) virus, H5N1, which continues to cross borders, is a possible source of the next pandemic should the virus become easily transmissible between humans.









The project includes two objectives


- The first is deeply doing risk analysis on cross-border spread of animal influenza in the trade areas of borders collaborating with other APEC Economies, especially focusing on the risk assessment on crossborder spread of such diseases as Avian Influenza, Swine Influenza virus and pandemic influenza A/H1N1, and monitoring their changes of infection and virulence.





- The second is strengthening mutual understanding among inspection and quarantine agencies in APEC economies, promoting the technology cooperation and information communication on the prevention and control of Avian Influenza, upgrading the efficiency and quality of law enhancement cooperation and optimizing the cooperation mechanism to cut-off the transmission of Avian Influenza cross-border.





























Based on the implement of the project, we will propose a new way of risk analysis on cross-border spread of animal influenza in the trade areas of border.

The mathematical model of cross-border transmition of disease, the evaluation model of losses and the management of the animal influenza threat will directly contribute to the prevention and control of animal influenza.

We will share and discuss the risk analysis report and experiences with the management of the animal influenza threat with other APEC economies during the forum.





The project will be carried out under the guidance of APEC Secretariat, and the risk analysis report on cross-border spread of animal influenza and the management of the animal influenza threat will be submitted and evaluated by APEC Secretariat and research organizations
