However, there may be a role for existing Issuing Bodies –

advising exporters as they transition to self-certification

Educating exporters to self-certify – a possible role for certifying bodies:

- »General education
- »Consultancy
- »Liaison with Competent Processing Authority (Customs)

Processing Authority (Customs)

Customs' roles – tariff preference:

- »Exports assisting exporters to interpret preference entitlement on their trade (to the other Party / Parties)
- »Imports ensuring preference is only allowed for qualifying imports
