PPFS Operating Principles

- The PPFS should be the primary mechanism APEC uses in cooperation with other APEC fora to address food security policy concerns and should oversee all issues related to, and affecting, food security to drive economic growth and prosperity with dignity for people in the region.
- The long term goal of the PPFS shall be the attainment of a food system structure by 2020 sufficient to provide lasting food security to APEC member economies. The PPFS target will be to provide food supplies to be sufficient, nutritious and safe.
- PPFS should focus on providing clear advice to APEC to make sustained progress towards food security goals.
- PPFS should operate in a highly respectful, collaborative manner to deliver progress against an agreed to work plan.

Further Steps

- Final version of the Action Plan is distributed to PPFS Members and the PPFS Chair informs the APEC Senior Officials;
- September 25, 2012 PPFS Members to express interest in participation in WGs and in potential leadership of WGs (this is not a closed date; Members can still join WGs later);
- October 01, 2012 Management Council to decide upon candidates for WGs' Chairs/Vice-Chairs positions and launches voting procedure;
- October 15, 2012 WGs' Chairs/Vice-Chairs are announced and launch their activity;
- February 01, 2013 WGs to provide draft reports.



Guidelines for Working Groups

- A result-oriented discussion to achieve tangible outcome is highly recommended;
- All discussion materials are provided to the APEC Secretariat and distributed in two weeks before the session; ABAC Secretariat will organize PPFS access to the information in a stock-take;
- Monitoring and tracking progress of prioritized initiative per top priority is highly recommended;
- Duration of the PPFS' session will depend on WG's agenda;
- Additional plenary or Management Council meetings may be scheduled as necessary. Management Council meetings will be held coincident with ABAC meetings.
