VERIFY HALAL CERTIFICATION IN MALAYSIA



Malaysia consumers use their mobile phones or computer to verify if a products is halalcertified

- Service live since 2007
- Consumers send bar code number via SMS and receive response with halalcertification status
- GS1 worked closely with government certification body (JAKIM)

VERIFY FOOD TRACEABILITY IN CHINA



Mobile application to access food traceability information

- Consumers scan barcode and enter "Batch/Lot" number printed on packaging
- GS1 is trusted source and enabler working with Chinese Government

WHERE GS1 HELPS TODAY

VERIFY FOOD ALLERGENS IN AUSTRALIA

Mobile application to check for allergens in food products

- Consumers with iPhones can access detailed product information including allergens such as wheat, egg, peanuts and shellfish
- In line with Department of Health and Ageing and Australian Food and Grocery Council (AFGC) plans for "extended food labeling"
- Pilot limited to Nestlé products in Australia










Hong Kong Product information and authentication portal

Extensive product information including its shelf life, country of origin, ingredients, packaging, images, and certifications and test reports



















SUMMARY
