1998 ILO DECLARATION

- LABOUR STANDARDS
- RELATIONSHIP WITH CORE LABOUR CONVENTIONS

UNIVERSAL CONSENSUS

- Fundamental labor principles and rights
- ILO: competent body
- Labor standards should not be used with protectionist purposes
- Not to question comparative advantage of any country on the basis of the ILO 1998 Declaration
- Violation of fundamental principles and rights at work cannot be invoked or used as a legitimate comparative advantage
