
What We Want To Do Next...


- Continue efforts to promote RIA among Ministries and agencies through pilot projects

- Facilitate full implementation of RIA with assistance from OECD experts and Jacobs, Cordova & Assoc.




- ☐ Streamlining administrative processes and enhancing One-Stop Centre (OSC) : OSC1 Submission
