The wide gap in the achievement of PISA 2012 among APEC economies, have prompted serious concerns among policy makers, educationist and other stakeholders over the state of the education system in APEC economies. Thus this symposium will allow member economies learn about the best practices, educational development strategies and educational systems around the world. Network with other APEC economies would help to identify the characteristics of the curriculum, schools, teachers and students that contribute to students' performance in reading, mathematics and science literacy. This will further facilitate economies to come out with recommendations that can be use to guide economies to improve their standing at the international comparison. More importantly the input from the project will provide directions for the improvement of mathematics and science teacher quality in enhancing student learning skills in the 21 <sup>st</sup> century at the economy level. The symposium will be held for 4 days in Penang, Malaysia in October 2014. A symposium proceeding which encompasses of good practices will be disseminated to the APEC economies.

### **Project Synopsis**

This symposium is important to provide a platform for the member economies to bench mark their performance in PISA which is a large-scale assessment attempt to measure and compare proficiency in reading, mathematics, and science in a large number of countries including the APEC economies.

The PISA results show distinct groups of high-performers in mathematics among APEC Economies: with Shanghai, China, scoring the best result of 613, followed closely by Singapore (573) and Hong Kong (561), Taiwan (560), South Korea (554), Japan (536) and Vietnam (511). The Australia (504) and New Zealand (500) the USA trailing this group at 481. Thailand, Malaysia, Chile, Mexico, Indonesia and Peru rank bottom third among participating countries in PISA.

This will be an opportunity to policy maker, stakeholders, researchers, teachers in the APEC economies especially PISA top-performing economies to share their experiences and best practices in PISA with the under-performing economies. The input gathered from this project will enable economies to identify the characteristics of the curriculum, schools, teachers and students that contribute to students' performance in reading, mathematics and science literacy and how the students apply the knowledge in familiar settings, both in and outside of school to real life situations and be equipped for full participation in society.

The symposium will further facilitate economies to come out with resolutions to improve the economy standing at the international comparison. More importantly the input from the project will provide directions through constructive actions and strategies for the improvement of mathematics and science teacher quality in enhancing student learning skills in the 21<sup>st</sup> century at the economy level.
