Welcome to APEC

A very warm welcome to APEC (Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation)!

APEC is a unique organisation with characteristics that may make your experience at APEC events and meetings different from other international or regional meetings you might be used to. Below are some of the key features of APEC and some background to help you understand why we operate the way we do.

- APEC was founded in 1989 (see APEC's History and 1989 Ministerial Declaration)
- APEC's goal is to support sustainable economic growth and prosperity in the Asia-Pacific Region; its agenda has 3 pillars: trade and investment liberalisation, business facilitation, and economic and technical cooperation (see more about APEC's purpose and achievements)
- APEC is an <u>economic</u> organisation with 21 Member <u>Economies</u>; APEC is not a political organisation (see <u>Seoul APEC Declaration</u>)
- In addition, APEC has 3 official observers the <u>Pacific Economic Cooperation Council (PECC)</u>, the <u>Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN) Secretariat</u>, and the <u>Pacific Islands Forum (PIF)</u> Secretariat
- APEC has a formal structure, headed by meetings of APEC's Economic Leaders (see APEC's Structure)
- Day to day management of most of APEC is overseen by Senior Officials from the 21 Economies, who collectively meet regularly as 'SOM' the Senior Officials Meeting (see <u>current list of Senior Officials</u>), though there are some other parts of the broader system not under SOM's direction
- APEC's Host Economy changes every year in 2016 it is Peru (see Peru 2016)
- APEC has a Secretariat based in Singapore which headed by an Executive Director (see <u>APEC Secretariat</u>), and a Policy Support Unit (see <u>APEC Policy Support Unit</u>); the Secretariat supports the operation of the organisation and the Policy Support Unit provides economic research
- APEC operates on the <u>principles</u> of <u>volunteerism</u> and <u>consensus</u>; non-binding decisions are taken by consensus and there are no votes or majority decisions; outcomes themselves have no legal force and are implemented voluntarily; APEC is neither a negotiating body nor a rules-making organisation
- APEC also operates on the basis of a number of policies and guidelines, including on issues such as
 hosting and chairing meetings, 'non-member' (guest) participation, documentation, publications and
 more (see APEC's <u>Policies and Guidelines</u>); each forum within APEC may also have its own terms of
 reference that further governs its work (please do consult such governing documents)
- APEC conducts a significant number of projects each year (see background on APEC Projects)
- APEC has an <u>Information Management Portal</u> (AIMP), which includes a <u>Meeting Document Database</u> (MDDB), <u>Project Database</u> (PDB), and <u>Collaboration System</u> (ACS). Parts of the AIMP require a user login, available to member economy delegates please email <u>aimp@apec.org</u> to request one.
