

Additional Protocol to the Framework Agreement: Pacific Alliance FTA



- 19 Chapters on the following areas:
 - market access
 - rules of origin
 - technical barriers to trade
 - sanitary and phytosanitary measures
 - trade facilitation and customs cooperation
 - government procurement
 - e-commerce
 - o financial services
 - maritime transportation services
 - telecommunications
 - investment and dispute resolution
 - o institutional issues.



Additional Protocol to the Framework Agreement: Pacific Alliance FTA

- Members agreements:
 - Eliminate 92% of their tariffs when the agreement enters into force. The remaining 8% will have tariff reduction periods between 3 and 17 years (except for sugar).
 - Establish a "cumulative rules of origin mechanism", to promote regional value chains.
 - Develop trade facilitation actions, such as the reduction of customs procedures through the development of a framework for the interoperability of their foreign trade single windows; customs cooperation and mutual assistance in data interchange.
 - Open public procurement markets.



Committee on Rules of Origin and Procedures related to Origin, Trade Facilitation and Customs Cooperation

- Functions related to the Trade Facilitation and Customs Cooperation Chapter:
 - a) To monitor the implementation and administration of the Chapter.
 - b) To propose to the Free Trade Commission any modification or interpretation of the Chapter.
 - c) To ensure the application of customs legislation by cooperation and assistance among customs administrations.
 - d) To address any other matter relating to the Chapter.
- Meets once a year (date and agenda previously agreed by the Parties).
- Special meetings determined by the Parties.



Trade Facilitation Chapter of Pacific Alliance FTA

Main tasks:

- To give tools and legal instruments to traders especially MSMEs to produce competitive products and services (quality, timeliness, volume and price).
- To promote faster, expeditious and efficient services by reducing paperwork, time and costs in trade and greater ease in collecting taxes on international transactions.

TRADE FACILITATION IN THE PACIFIC ALLIANCE FTA OBJECTIVES

Technical Group of Authorized Economic Operator

- Implementation and strengthening of Authorized Economic Operator (OAS) programs by the customs administrations of the Parties in accordance with the WCO General Framework for Securing and Facilitating Global Trade.
- Signing of mutual recognition agreements of the Parties' OAS programs.

Working Group of Interoperability of Single Windows for Foreign Trade (known in Spanish as VUCEs)

- Implementation and improvement of Single Windows for Foreign Trade (SWFT) for trade facilitation.
- Securing interoperability among SWFTs for exchanging trade data and verifying information of foreign trade operations.

TRADE FACILITATION WORK IN PROGRESS

- Advancing in interoperability of the Single Window for Foreign Trade
 - Electronic exchange of phytosanitary certificates
 - Homologation of digital certificates of origin
- Developing of a methodology to reduce clearance time.
- Implementing of the Action Plan for the Mutual Recognition of Economic Operators Authorized.
- External Relationship:
 - European Union (Trade Facilitation Seminar)
 - MERCOSUR (Customs Cooperation: Roadmap PA – MERCOSUR)



TRADE FACILITATION AND CUSTOMS COOPERATION AGENDA 2017 – 2018

- Current Coordinator:
