

Transport Inspectors (TIs)

What is a Transport Inspector?

- Transport Inspectors are highly trained employees of the Queensland Government's Department of Transport and Main Roads.
- They play a major role in contributing to the safety of Queensland drivers and protecting the state's road infrastructure

What powers do Transport Inspectors have?

- Transport Inspectors have broad powers relating to intercepting and examining vehicles.
- They operate within strict guidelines and can issue on-the-spot fines for a range of offences or report matters for court action.



Transport Inspectors

Recognising a Transport Inspector

- Officers are easily recognised as they wear a Transport Inspector uniform.
 All inspectors display an official badge.
- Transport Inspectors now have new-look vehicles.
- The magenta, white and yellow decals on the vehicles makes it easier to identify a Transport Inspector.








Heavy vehicle compliance and over size over mass (OSOM)






Personalised transport
