






Indonesia in Corruption Perception Index



Indonesia in Ease of Doing Business Rank


What is measured in *Doing Business*?

Q. How well or badly would you say the current government is handling the following matters, or haven't you heard enough to say? "Fighting corruption in government". Base: all respondents, excluding missing responses. Response categories "Very badly" and "Fairly badly" are combined into "Badly"; and response categories "Very well" and "Fairly well" are combined into "Well".



The Remaining Challenges

- Very various SIZE, SCOPE, MATURITY IN COMPLIANCE, including GEOGRAPHICAL characteristics of the corporations in Indonesia
- The limitation of regulation for KPK in handling corruption among private sector
- Cultural aspect on giving facilitation payment, entertainment fee, tipping, etc.
