Update on Key Staffing Issues

Objective

1. The objective of this paper is to update BMC on the key staffing issues between August 2020 and August 2021.

Staffing

- 2. As at August 2021, the Secretariat's staff strength stands at 70 compared to 72 during the last update in August 2020. The gender composition of the Secretariat stands at 30 [43%] males and 40 [57%] females. Among the Directors and ED, 9 are female and 17 are male.
- 3. Member economies have continued to expeditiously fill vacated posts and since August 2020, the following changes in seconded staff have taken place:

Retirement and Resigned

- 5. Mr Rahmatullah s/o Samsudden, Office Assistant, retired on 25th May 2021. Ms Sandra Koh, Receptionist will be retiring on 25th August 2021. There are currently no plans to fill in the posts.
- 6. Ms Daphney Chew, Program Executive resigned on 7th July 2021 and Ms Beh Jia Hui, Program Executive resigned on 11th July 2021. Two new Program Executives have been recruited to fill in the posts. Ms Dwi Prameswari joined the Secretariat on 7th July 2021 and Ms Estella Ho joined on 21st July 2021.

Strengthening the Secretariat

7. The Secretariat, initiated a comprehensive HR review in February 2020. The review included salary benchmarking and performance management. US-SEGA funded this review by engaging a HR consultant to undertake the review which was completed in August 2020. Please refer to the separate report by the HR Unit on the HR review recommendations updates.

Training and Development

8. Users training for the new Performance Appraisal were carried out with individual Units throughout the Performance appraisal period. In house training by the Project Management Unit and the Communications & Public Affairs Unit were also carried out for Program Directors and Program Executives.

External Support

9. The Secretariat has housed the team from the US Support for Economic Growth in Asia (US-SEGA) project that replaced the US-APEC Technical Assistance to Advance Regional Integration (US-ATAARI) project with effect from January 2019. The Secretariat also continues to benefit from the Australian Government Effectiveness Grant which funds the hiring of one full-tome staff of the Project Management Unit.
