Businesses spend much time and resources for administrative tasks required for paper-based trade procedures, including preparing, sorting, and shipping of various documents. In recent years, in order to facilitate trade, digital-technology-enabled "trade platforms" have been developed and started digitalizing some trade procedures. They bring tremendous benefits such as reducing the amount of paperwork with overlapping information and improving the transparency of procedures.

In this workshop, which is the first of a series of four, we will focus on trade platforms, introducing the characteristics of different trade platforms currently in operation. The speakers will discuss the future of trade platforms and challenges in ensuring interoperability among them.
