

MALAYSIA'S VIEW ON NTMs



Non-Tariff Measures



01

A range of laws/regulations/requirements that influence the flow of goods across borders Such as SPS and TBT, also customs

- procedures

02

NTMs are policy measures, other than ordinary customs tariff, that can potentially have an economic effect on international trade in goods, changing quantities traded, or prices, or both

03

For agro-food, requires greater coordination among agencies (customs/those responsible for SPS)

In place for legitimate regulatory goals

NTMS




- SPS measures which are based on scientific evidence
- Documentation, certificate of origin, health certificate
- Licenses used to verify compliance with safety rules

- Excessively stringent regulations or SPS measures without scientific basis
- Licenses used to restrict imports Quotas
- Additional burden of private attestation or certification

NTBS

Emerging NTMs in Global Markets

- Measures that is maintained without sufficient scientific basis
- Measures that restricts origins of the products or the inputs



NTMs ARE OFTEN BADLY DESIGNED, INCOHERENT • Did not target the problem

- Too broad
