Proposed Workplan for 2014 Fora: TRANSPORTATION WORKING GROUP (TPTWG)

1. Proposed Work Plan for 2014 in Response to Leaders/Ministers/SOM/SCE Priorities and Decisions, and to ABAC recommendations.

As the Working Group responsible for achieving the liberalization and facilitation of transport trade and services, and enhancing safe, secure, efficient and environment-friendly transportation systems across the Asia-Pacific Region, the Transportation Working Group (TPTWG) aligns its activities with instructions from the Leaders' and Ministers' Statements as well as SOM and SCE priorities and decisions. It likewise considers applicable recommendations from the APEC Business Advisory Council (ABAC), to ensure that the Working Group is cognizant of the views of the private sector.

The work of the TPTWG will contribute to the advancement of the 2014 host economy's priorities ((1) Advancing Regional Economic Integration (REI); (2) Promoting Innovative Development, Economic Reform and Growth; and (3) Connectivity and the Infrastructure Gap) with a particular focus on: promoting greater participation of women in the transport sector; supply chain connectivity; travel facilitation; and emergency preparedness. TPTWG will also incorporate into its work program the priorities outlined by APEC Transportation Ministers at the 8th Transportation Ministers Meeting, held in Tokyo in September 2013. The 9th APEC Transportation Ministerial Meeting is expected to be held in October 2015, in the Philippines.

Practical Safety Measures to Save Lives for Motorcycle and Scooter Users in Developing Economies	The project aims to facilitate the development of practical safety measures to save the lives of motorcycle and scooter users in developing economies which heavily depend on this mode of transport. The proposal would comprise a regional workshop to identify road safety priorities and effective countermeasures for serious motorcycle and scooter crashes, tailored to the needs of a number of economies including Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Viet Nam. A four day workshop will be conducted in October 2014 in Hanoi, with participants	

from relevant government agencies, industry bodies and community organisations. Regional road safety organisations and the Asian Development Bank have also expressed interest in contributing to the project, along with the Hanoi-based Asia Injury Prevention Foundation and the Australian Road Research Board. The proposal will include collaboration with the APEC Automotive Dialogue and the APEC Health Working Group. The chief benefit of this proposal will be socio-economic savings from reduced crash rates and less injury severity from crashes. Specific deliverables will be the identification of motorcycle and scooter safety priorities and practical safety measures tailored for particular developing economies. The project will particularly benefit developing economies that depend heavily on motorcycle and scooter transport, but with outcomes for APEC-wide application.
