

High Level Policy Dialogue on Agricultural Biotechnology Iloilo, Philippines 30 September – 1 October 2015





Goals:

- Establishment and maintenance of mechanisms to ensure continued information exchange on economies' experience with agricultural biotechnology
- Promote transparent, science-based and functioning regulatory systems and the development, application and trade of innovative biotechnologies for the benefit of APEC member economies
- Endeavor to develop solutions to global challenges with respect to innovative agricultural biotechnology



Goal 1: Information Exchange

Activities/Deliverables:

- HLPDAB Contact List (Coordinator: APEC Secretariat)
- Update and maintain the APEC Agricultural Biotechnology Website (APEC Secretariat, Member Economies)
- Annual Meeting held at either the APEC Food Ministerial or a Senior Officials Meeting (Host APEC Economy Member)
- Workshops, meetings, and papers held in conjunction with the Annual Meeting or (APEC Sponsoring Economies)

Goal 2: Functioning Regulatory System

Activities/Deliverables:

- Promote understanding and confidence in APEC economy regulatory systems by sharing knowledge at APEC HLPDAB meetings and workshops. (APEC Member Economies)
- Promote greater alignment of national standards with relevant international standards among APEC economies and build public confidence in those systems. (Host Economy)



Goal 2: Functioning Regulatory System (Cont.)

Activities/Deliverables:

- Provide opportunities for member economies to share information and experiences with respect to the positive development and application of biotechnology with other APEC fora related to food security. (Member Economies)
- Develop a platform or publicize existing platforms for use by APEC economy farmers to share innovative technology. (Coordinator: Indonesia)

Goal 2: Functioning Regulatory System (Cont.)

Activities/Deliverables:

 Conduct a technical short course for APEC economy regulators highlighting regional regulatory developments and technology adoption challenges and successes in a week long course in the Philippines in 2015 (United States, Philippines)



Goal 3: Innovative Agricultural Biotechnology

Activities/Deliverables:

- Share information on new biotechnology products being developed that can help to address the challenges of increasing food production and making food production systems more resilient and environmental challenges.
- Workshop on Plant Biotechnology Life Cycle, Sept. 2014, session on *Research and Development* (United States)
- Develop platform for co-development and transfer of innovative technology to benefit small scale farmers (Indonesia)

Goal 3: Innovative Agricultural Biotechnology (Cont.)

Activities/Deliverables:

 Promote mechanisms for collaboration and sharing of information and experiences among member economies to address common challenges including low level presence, asynchronous approvals and risk communication. (Member Economies)




Overarching Aims:

- Support the development of pro-trade policies and regulations

- Progress from principles to practical application
- Enhance the capacity to identify common interests
- Build productive capacity amongst members

APPROVAL PROCESSConcept Notes and Proposals



Approval Stage 1: Concept Notes

- Three pages maximum
- Provides an overview of the project, especially key ideas
- Approval by APEC members
- Only approved concept notes can get funding

Approval Stage 2: Project Proposals

- Only for 'approved' concept notes
- Expansion of concept note idea: usually around 12 pages
- Provides details of the project: how it will work step by step
- Key focus: ensuring project quality

APPROVAL PROCESS How are projects approved?



Forum discusses, then endorses and prioritises Concept Note/s



Committees use the 2015 Funding Criteria to rank and prioritise CNs overall, for each fund



CNs approved for funding starting with highest priority, until available funds are depleted



CNs expanded into full proposals and assessed by PMU



Proposals recommended to BMC (projects >US\$200,000 require SOM approval)

APPROVAL PROCESS





Members assign a priority to concept notes on the basis of:

- Alignment with the priorities of their group
- Alignment with the priorities of your economy
- · Alignment with the priorities of the host economy
- Support for regional economic integration
- Support for growth (balanced, sustainable, inclusive, innovative, secure)
- Demonstration of wide benefits/ support for multiple economies
- Strong project quality

APPROVAL PROCESS

Previous Concept Note Ranking and Prioritization



Members assign a <u>rank</u> to concept notes on the basis of funding criteria identified by the host economy:

First projects to be considered for funding:

Rank 1: demonstrates direct link to promoting regional economic integration via free and open trade and investment

Next projects to be considered for funding:

Rank 2: directly support the Action Plan in the APEC Leaders' Growth Strategy

Last projects to be considered for funding:

Rank 3: linked to other priorities identified by Leaders and Ministers but less closely linked to regional economic integration via free and open trade and investment

APPROVAL PROCESSFunding Criteria - 2015 Rank 1



<u>Rank 1 topics</u> (Projects that demonstrate a direct link to promoting regional economic integration via free and open trade and investment):

- Supporting the Multilateral Trading System and the Bogor Goals
- Activities outlined in the Beijing Roadmap for APEC's Contribution to the Realization of the FTAAP
- Building an open economy in the Asia-Pacific featuring innovative development, interconnected growth, and shared interests
- Trade Facilitation and Liberalization
- SME Development, including access to regional and global markets
- Services Trade and Investment Facilitation and Liberalization
- Activities outlined in Global Value Chains (GVCs) Blueprint
- Supply Chain Connectivity, including Cooperation Network on Green Supply Chain, Model E-Port Network, Cross-border E-commerce Innovation and Development, Customs 3M (Mutual Recognition of Control, Mutual Assistance of Enforcement and Mutual Sharing of Information) Strategic Framework through infrastructure development and logistics cooperation
- Structural Reform, including overcoming the MIT and implementation of ANSSR
- Connectivity, including the implementation of the APEC Connectivity Blueprint on enhancing physical, institutional and people-to-people connectivity
- Investment Facilitation and Liberalization
- Facilitation of trade and investment to support the LNG market in the APEC region, including by relaxing
 destination clauses

APPROVAL PROCESS Funding Criteria - 2015 Rank 1



Rank 1 topics (CONTINUED):

- Infrastructure Development and Investment, including through PPP
- Environmental Goods and Services, including trade and investment
- Next Generation Trade and Investment Issues
- Ease of Doing Business
- Standards, conformity assessment, technical regulations, regulatory cooperation, and regulatory coherence, including good regulatory practices
- Protection and enforcement of intellectual property rights, including trade secrets
- Internet Economy, including the implementation of APEC Initiative of Cooperation to Promote Internet Economy
- Information technology and digital economy, including e-commerce and ICT infrastructure
- Ocean-related issues for economic growth, including Blue Economy, conservation and sustainable development
 of marine and coastal resources, particularly fisheries
- Travel facilitation for enhancing mobility
- Human capital development, including activities outlined in Strategic Plan on Capacity Building to Promote
 Trade and Investment Agenda, education and capacity building, as well as cross-border education cooperation
- Building sustainable and resilient communities
- Food safety and security, including implementation of the Food Security Roadmap Towards 2020
- Emergency preparedness and disaster management, including activities relating to the efficient movement of capital, goods, services and people

Rank 2 topics (Projects that directly support the APEC Leaders' Growth Strategy):

- Macro-economic policy coordination and information sharing
- Financial markets

Inclusive Growth

- Women and the Economy
- Activities/issues related to addressing the social dimension of globalization, including health and gender

 Sustainable Growth
- Energy efficiency, energy security and energy resiliency
- Urbanization to growth, including smart city and live-friendly cooperation

Secure Growth

- Human security. Health and health systems, including the implementation of the Healthy Asia-Pacific 2020
- Counter terrorism

Innovative Growth

- · Innovation policy and research cooperation, green growth
- Agricultural biotechnologies, including promotion of sustainable agricultural development
- Science and technology and ICT approaches in disaster preparedness and risk reduction


New Concept Note Ranking and Prioritization Econ


To improve selection and quality of concept notes by:

- providing a more systematic and standardised process for assessing concept notes
- providing a systematic and standardised process for Sub Forum priorities to be included in Committee decisions
- ensuring that assessments also focus on important project quality issues in a standardised way

Concept Note Selection Process PO prepares concept note, gets endorsement from Sub forum Sub Forum members score (out of 20) all concept notes submitted by the group Committee scores concept notes (out of 40) from all Sub Forms in their portfolio Secretariat averages and combines scores to create a final score out of 60 If required, concept notes are further prioritized by Principal Decision Makers BMC approves concept notes 'in-principle', starting with highest score, until available funds are depleted

CONCEPT NOTES Improving Your Submission



- Ensure the project is strategically relevant. Look at:
 - > APEC Goals, Forum Work Plan
 - > APEC's expertise
 - Funding Source: Osaka Action Agenda (TILF), Developing Economies (ASF)
 - > Funding Criteria for the year of submission
- Do your Research:
 - ➤ Research previous / current projects to demonstrate relevance to APEC priorities and linkages to other work, both inside and outside of APEC
 - Explain how your project avoids duplication and leverages other work
- Be Clear
 - Be clear and specific this applies to all sections, even the title!
 - Use standard, non-technical language
- Cross-cutting!!
