Why Traveler-Friendly Airports?

- ▶ For travelers, an airport is a gateway, creates a first impression, and is an economic and cultural showcase.
- Inefficient and stressful entry and exit processes often create an uncomfortable experience at airports.
- Traveler-friendly airports would mean enhanced passenger processing and an easier, more efficient, and a less stressful travel experience.
- ▶ A positive perception of APEC-region airports would lead to increased travel to and within the region.

Objectives

- Develop a list of best practices that contribute to creating a travelerfriendly airport and develop recommendations for implementing these practices across the region.
- Improve both the travel experience for passengers as well as overall airport operation.
- Develop an aspirational standard/goal for APEC airports in terms of entry/exit metrics and other travel-friendly best practices.
- Improve perception of destinations to increase travel to and within the APEC region.

Activities

- Establish a framework to identify/select pilot airports.
- ▶ Collect and disseminate information about a range of policies, procedures and approaches used by airports to improve the traveler experience.
- ▶ Develop characteristics and best practices for traveler-friendly airports and recommendations for implementing these practices in the Asia-Pacific region.
- ▶ Develop aspirational standard(s)/goal(s) for Asia-Pacific airports.
- ▶ Identify key indicators to define and measure a "traveler-friendly" airport.
