Policy speech by Japanese Foreign Minister was delivered at the international symposium on Energy security and investment in Asia in July 2017.

The speech "Energy and Resource Diplomacy of Japan – Global Vision for a Shared Future" highlights the cataclysmic change in the international energy scene, symbolized by "three shifts" (①shift in suppliers, ⊜shift in consumers, ⊛shift towards low-carbonization), visions and strategies of Japanese energy and resource diplomacy, and way forward to achieve the goal.
