Indonesia



- Archipelago of 17.504 islands, lies across the equator
- Area: land 1.904.569 km² (37% of total); ocean 3.257.483 km² (63% of total)
- 34 provinces, 514 regencies/ municipalities
- The world's 4th most populous country (250 M in 2015 census)
- More than 370 ethnics, more than twice as many distinct languages as well as languages diversity

Law No 18/ 2012 concerning Food

Definition of food safety

Prevent food from possibility of biological, chemical, and other pollution that can interfere, harm, and endanger human health

Not conflicting religion, belief, culture

Article 69 Food safety is conducted through

Food sanitation

Control of food additives

Control of genetically engineered food products

Control of food irradiation

Establishment of food packaging standard

Issuing of food quality and safety guarantee

Halal product guarantee for those required

Consumer control sub-system (e.g. consumer empowerment, social punishment)

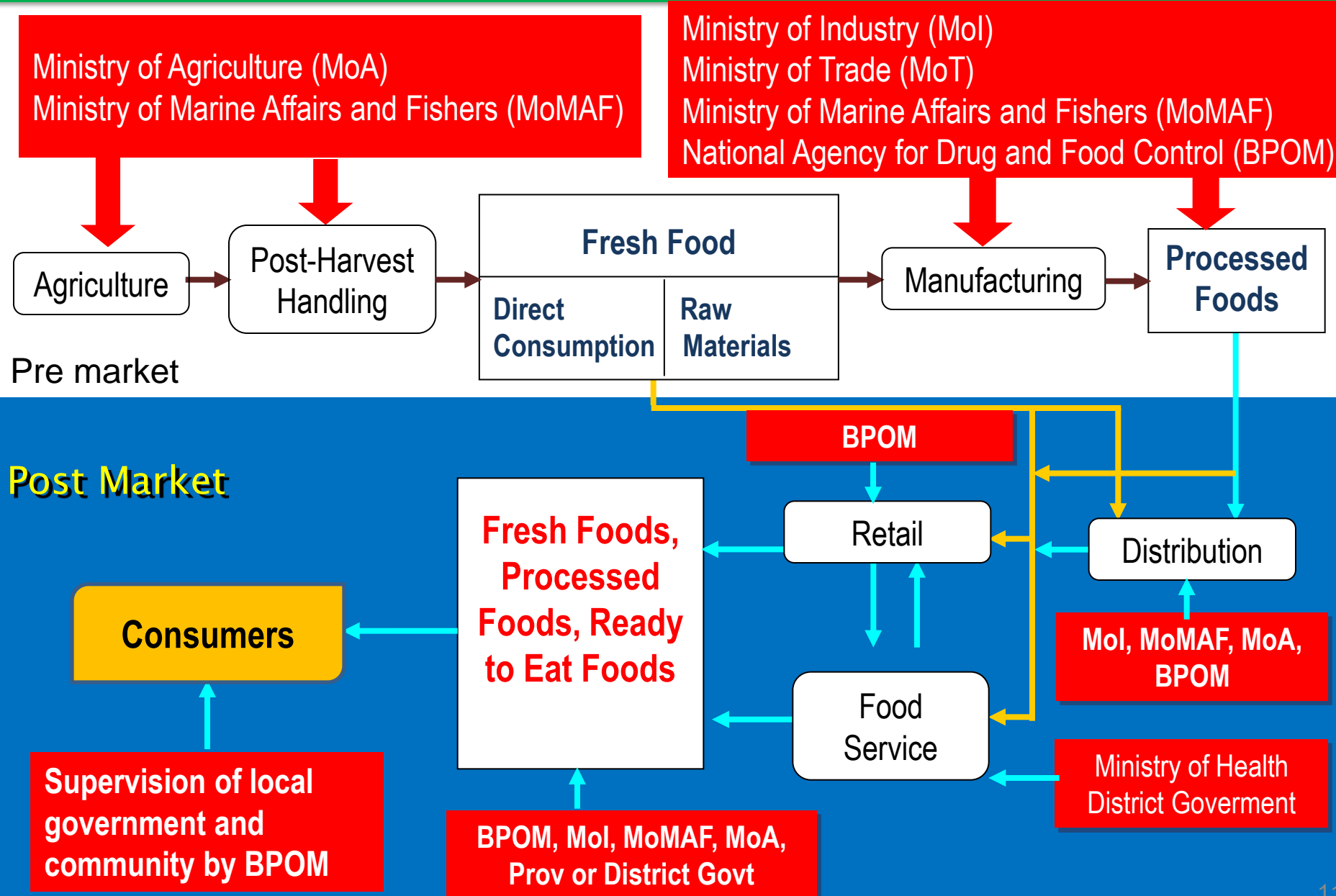

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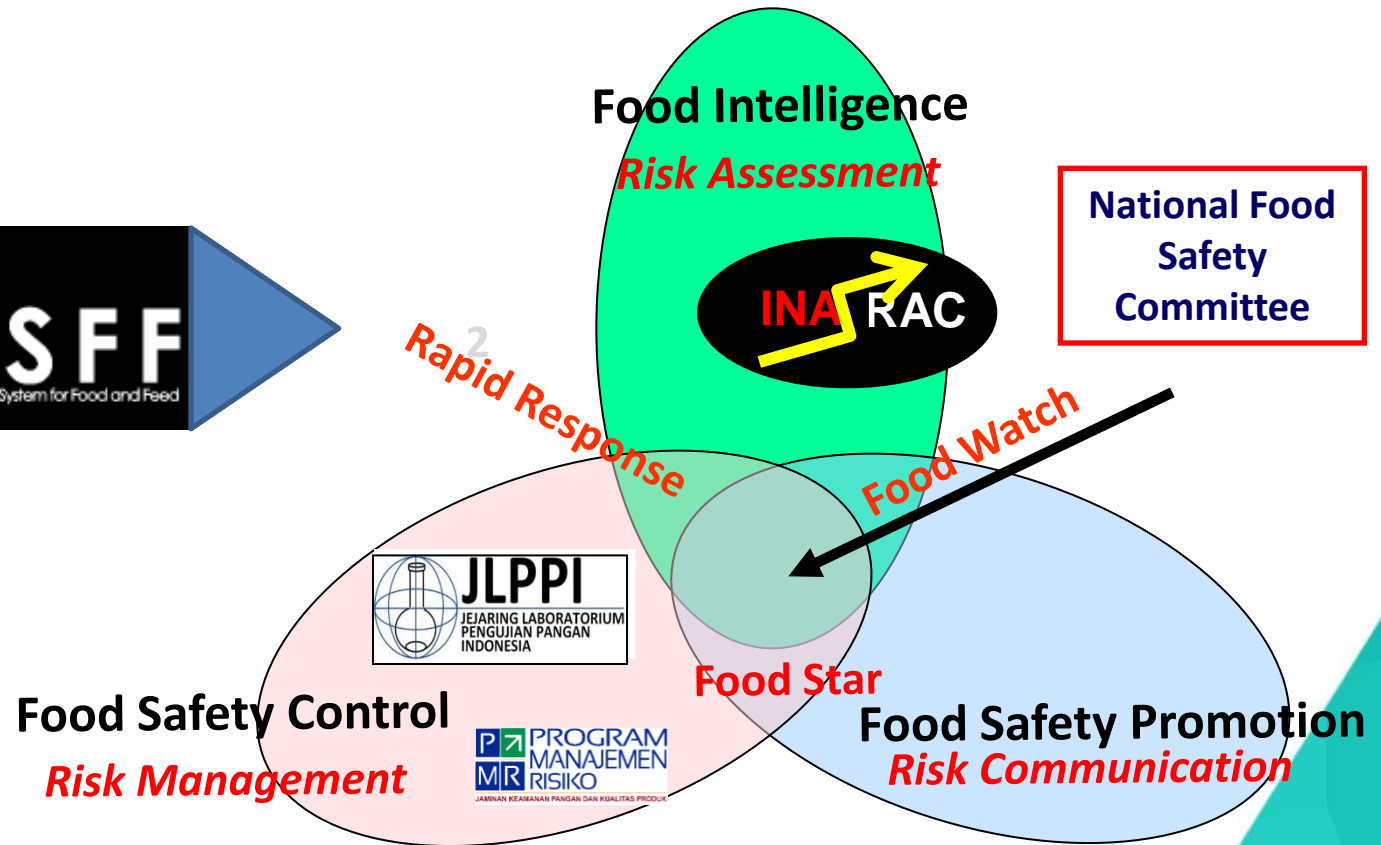


Sharing task and responsibility in food control based on Government Regulation No. 28 Years 2004

NADFC FOOD CONTROL PROGRAMS



- Risk-Based Food Inspection
- Sampling and testing of targeted food products
- Strengthening for inspection on Food Products Label at the Port Entry Border and Distributors
 - Improving food safety and quality
- Capacity Building (Competence-Based Training for National Food Inspectors)

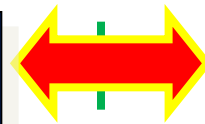

Post market control

- Inspection of production and distribution facilities
- Food sampling and laboratory testing
- Monitoring on label and advertisement

Law enforcement

- Suspension
- Public warning
- Product recall, removal
- Banned license
- Penalty (imprisonment)/ fine
