Recent regulatory developments

- Gradual harmonization of educational systems (impact of PISA, Bologna)
- National qualification frameworks
- National accreditation and quality assurance frameworks
- Growing ease of recognition of foreign qualifications (eg. MRAs, Asia-Pacific Regional Convention on the Recognition of Qualifications in Higher Education 2011)
- Almost zero regulation of non-formal education




ASEAN students undertaking HE programs abroad

Over 250,000 ASEAN students are taking degrees outside their home country (UNESCO 2015 data)


Intra-ASEAN mobility is mostly to neighbouring countries with a higher GDP per capita




Mobility out of the region is predominantly to major English language destinations

Chart shows top 10 countries plus ASEAN >5





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



CHART 1: PARTICIPATION IN LEARNING ABROAD (by Headcount) 1998, 2005, 2007 and 2009–2014



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
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Common persistent barriers

- Cross-border supply restriction on local providers partnering with foreign institutions, non-recognition of international online education
- Consumption abroad student visa restrictions (processing time, restrictions on work rights)
- Commercial presence institutional ranking, disciplines, cumbersome regulation of 'inputs'
- Presence of natural persons restrictions on foreign teaching and professional staff
