








Gender Mainstreaming Policies










- Advisory and statutory bodies (ASBs)
 - offer advice to the government on public policies
 - take up executive functions/statutory duties
- ASBs comprise mostly citizens of diversified background
- About 500 ASBs comprising about 7,000 posts

Advisory Committee on Corruption

- advises any aspects of the corruption problem
- oversees the overall operational, staffing and administrative policies



Operations Review Committee

oversees all ICAC investigations

 advises, steers, examines and monitors the corruption prevention work



Citizens Advisory Committee on Community Relations


- monitors public attitudes towards corruption
- advises on the strategy of preventive education






Staff Composition












Way Forward
