


Figure 1. Evolution of PTAs with digital trade provisions.

FTA/RTAs with E-Commerce Provisions per Type of PTA




Figure 2. Type of PTA with digital trade provisions.

FTA/RTAs with E-Commerce Provisions per Region/Group





Figure 4. Parties to PTAs with digital trade provisions.

E-Commerce/Digital Trade Rules in the Asia-Pacific Region



Digital Trade Agreements in Asia-Pacific Region

CPTPP (signed March 2018)

- ✓ First mandatory provisions on cross-border data transfer, localization requirement of computing facilities (with LPPO (legitimate public policy objective) exceptions)
- ✓ Mandatory provision on prohibition of source code transfer requirement
- ✓ Provision on free access & use of Internet for e-commerce

❖ USMCA (signed November 2018)

- √ First chapter on 'digital trade'
- ✓ Mandatory provisions on cross-border data transfer, localization requirement of computing facilities (No LPPO exception for data localization req't)
- ✓ Prohibition of data localization requirement for financial data
- ✓ Liability exception for Internet Service Providers (ISP)

Digital Trade Agreements in Asia-Pacific Region

US-Japan DTA (signed January 2019)

- √ First stand-alone digital trade agreement
- ✓ Mandatory provision on source code & algorithm transfer requirement
- ✓ Mandatory provision on ICT goods that use cryptography
- ✓ Incorporation of all exception clauses (general exceptions, security exceptions, prudential exceptions, taxation)

❖ Singapore-Chile-New Zealand DEPA (signed June 2020)

- ✓ First Singapore-led template on digital trade rules ("modules" instead of chapters)
- ✓ Mandatory provisions on cross-border data transfer, localization requirement of computing facilities (non-binding obligation)
- ✓ Cooperation on various digital economy areas (AI, fintech, data innovation, digital identity etc.)

Digital Trade Agreements in Asia-Pacific Region

Australia-Singapore DEA (signed August 2020)

- ✓ Similar digital trade rules with CPTPP, USMCA, USJDTA
- ✓ Similar digital economy cooperation provisions with DEPA
- ✓ Least inclusion of exception clauses (only general exceptions clause) related to key obligations on data free flow

RCEP (signed November 2020)

- ✓ Chapter on 'Electronic Commerce'
- ✓ Mandatory provisions on cross-border data transfer, localization requirement of computing facilities (with LPPO exception, security exception)
- ✓ Non-application of dispute settlement procedures (non-binding provisions)

Data Liberalization Principles and Exceptions

- General convergence in DTAs on principle of digital trade facilitation
 - ✓ Liberalization of cross-border data transfer
 - ✓ Mandated prohibition of data localization requirements
- Various exception clauses on cross-border data transfer
 - ✓ LPPO exception
 - ✓ General exceptions
 - ✓ Security exceptions
 - ✓ Prudential & monetary policy exception
- Effort to achieve 'balance' between need for digital trade rules and preservation of policy space, different philosophies on data privacy

Fragmentation of Rules on Personal Data Protection


- Digital trade rules on data governance
 - ✓ Personal data protection
 - ✓ Cross-border data transfer
 - ✓ Data localization requirement
- Different policies on personal data protection in major economies
 - ✓ Principles of 'necessity' and 'proportionality' in national rules regulating data protection
 - ✓ Data privacy rights equivalent to human rights
 - ✓ 'Internet sovereignty'
- Lack of convergence on data governance related digital trade rules leading to different positions in WTO negotiations

Monopoly and Competition Principles in the Global Digital Market

- Competition issues in global online platform market
 - ✓ 'Network' and 'lock-in' effects of digital technologies
 - ✓ Prevalence of U.S. big tech companies in global digital market
- Digital Services Tax (DST)
 - ✓ Non-application of national taxation due to lack of physical permanent establishment
 - ✓ Application of DST based on annual sales (over 750 million Euro) in EU
 - ✓ Section 301 retaliatory tariffs by U.S.
- USJDTA and DEPA provisions on taxation
- DEPA and DEA provisions on cooperation on competition policies
- Agreement on global minimum corporate tax rate and global digital tax on all global companies

- U.S.-led template vs. Singapore-led template of digital trade rules
- "U.S. Indo-Pacific Digital Trade Agreement"
