CHAPTER 19: DIGITAL TRADE: WHAT'S MODIFIED

- Non-Discriminatory Treatment of Digital Products
 - Not subject to Annex reservations
 - No broadcasting carve out
- -Cross-Border Transfer of Information
 - Footnote 5: differential treatment for cross-border transfers
- Location of Computing Facilities
 - Reliance on General Exceptions
 - Commitments on financial services



CHAPTER 19: DIGITAL TRADE: WHAT'S MODIFIED (Continued)

- -Unsolicited Commercial Electronic Messages
 - Focus on "prevention" and "consent"
 - Applies to all electronic messages
- –Cybersecurity
 - "Risk-based" approaches to protect against cybersecurity risks

-Source Code

- Applies to all software source code and algorithms expressed in the source code
- Permits specific investigations, examinations, etc. by regulatory bodies or judicial authorities



CHAPTER 19: DIGITAL TRADE: WHAT'S NEW

—Interactive Computer Services

- Civil liability protections to Internet platforms for harmful usergenerated content
- Does not apply to Intellectual Property measures, enforcement of criminal laws or lawful orders from enforcement authorities

–Open Government Data

- Making available government information available to other actors (eg., private sector, academia) to advance social/economic objectives
- Parties determine which government information will be available in a machine-readable, open format
