








### The PEFC System – Global Reach, Local Impact




















- Developed by local stakeholder

- Subject to domesticl public consultation






### KFCC Impact on Forests in Korea





## Sustainable forest management certification

- Healthy workers (e.g., safety, training)

- Healthy local economy (e.g., jobs, income)


## Chain of custody certification

- Assurance of origin from sustainably managed forests
- Legal compliance
- Independently audited traceability from forests to consumers
- Covering requirements on health, safety and labour issues












## Third-Party Verified and Recognized in ESG Frameworks




